


Senate Bill 1: New Funding to Maintain Our Roads and Transit Systems

- ❖ SB 1 provides \$52.4 billion over the next 10 years for transportation in CA
- ❖ 12¢ gasoline excise tax increase
- Transportation Improvement Fee (\$25 to \$175) progressively based on a car's value
- ❖ Diesel sales tax and 20¢ excise tax increase

Marin County Focus \$8 million for roads in Marin \$3.2 million for Golden Gate Transit/Ferries \$600,000 for Marin Transit \$4.5 million for SMART

State Cap and Trade Funding Programs

Transit and Intercity Rail Capital Program (TIRCP)

Competitive program for major transit investments

Low Carbon Transit Operations Program (LCTOP)

Annual formula program for operators Projects must reduce greenhouse gases

Affordable Housing and Sustainable Communities (AHSC)

Opportunity for funding affordable housing & enhanced transportation infrastructure around transit

Marin County Focus

Cap and Trade Funding awarded to area transit operators to date

- ❖ \$11 million to SMART for rail cars awarded in 2016
- Since 2015 LCTOP program start, Marin transit operators have received over \$2 million
- ❖ Local projects include bus purchases for Golden Gate Transit and Marin Transit, and operating costs for Marin Transit Route 23
- Regional funds contributed to operators and Clipper program

Federal Funding Programs



Plan Bay Area 2040 Investment Plan

❖ Includes FTA funds for Golden Gate Transit and Marin Transit – replacement of buses, and greening fleet with zero-emission buses

Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Small Starts Program

- \$20 million for SMART Larkspur Extension approved by Congress
- SMART and MTC working with Congress and FTA to secure funds

Future Federal Funding

- Marin-Sonoma Narrows opportunity for future federal funding
- ❖ FAST Act funded through 2020, future Congressional and Administration action required to meet funding levels in Plan Bay Area 2040

Bridge Toll Programs

Richmond-San Rafael Bridge

Seismic retrofit, ongoing maintenance, rehabilitation – over \$1 billion in investment

Richmond-San Rafael Bridge Access Improvements under construction using bridge tolls

SMART

Over \$80 million in bridge tolls allocated to date

Bike/Pathway projects

Funded by Regional Measure 2 – Cal Park Hill Tunnel Rehabilitation and Bikeway, Central Marin Ferry Access Improvements, North South Greenway







	Proposed Resilience Actions
1	Develop a regional governance strategy for climate adaptation projects
2	Provide stronger policy leadership on resilient housing and infrastructure
3	Create new funding sources for adaptation and resilience
4	Establish and provide a resilience technical services team
5	Expand the region's network of natural infrastructure
6	Strengthen conservation efforts through funding advance mitigation
