


OBAG 3 Funding Capacity


- 4-year program
 - Fiscal Year (FY) 2023 FY 2026
- ❖ \$750 million total
 - \$188 million per year

Complementary Funding Backdrop

Leverage complementary funding to augment OBAG 3 and deliver regional priorities:



Amount	Fund Source	Purpose
\$750 million	OBAG 3 - STP/CMAQ FHWA formula funds	Regional and local projects that implement <i>Plan Bay Area 2050</i> strategies
\$85 million	Blue Ribbon One-time State and Federal funds	State and federal fund sources identified for near-term Blue Ribbon projects
\$103 million	REAP 2.0 One-time State funds	Planning and direct investments to advance Sustainable Communities Strategy - <i>Plan Bay Area 2050</i>
\$60 million	Carbon Reduction FHWA formula funds	Projects that reduce greenhouse gas emissions
~\$1 billion	Total	





OBAG 3 Principles

- Preserve effective program features to support regional objectives
- Advance *PBA 2050* implementation
- Incorporate recent policy initiatives and adapt to current landscape
- Advance equity through policies and investments
- Address federal requirements, including performance & recertification
- Coordinate with complementary fund sources
- Emphasize a shared, partnership approach through implementation

Regional Programs

Regional Program Highlights

- **♦** \$375 million
- ❖ 50% of OBAG 3 program
- Targeted to address climate and focused growth goals
- Coordinate and deploy PBA 2050 strategies well-suited to regional implementation

County & Local Programs

County & Local Program Highlights

- ❖ \$375 million
- ❖ 50% of OBAG 3 program
- \$340 million programmed through a regionwide call for projects process
 - Remaining \$35 million is provided for countywide planning activities

Call for Projects - *Now Underway*

- County Transportation Agencies (CTAs) assist with initial project review
- CTAs nominate a prioritized list of projects for each county; county nomination targets provided
- MTC selects projects based on prioritization by CTAs and additional regional considerations

- Annual traffic count reporting

 - Complete Streets checklist

Upcoming OBAG 3 Grant Opportunities

- **❖** \$44-100M Climate Initiatives
 - Letters of interest for electrification, parking programs solicited July 2022
 - Investment options September 2022
- ❖ \$26M Community-Based Transportation Planning (CBTP) and Community Choice
 - Guidelines adopted April 2022
 - Opportunities early 2023
- ❖ \$83M Growth Framework Implementation
 - Framework October 2022
 - Opportunities early 2023

- Other (in development):
 - Pavement Technical Assistance Program (PTAP)
 - LRSPs and technical assistance
 - Regional Active Transportation Plan implementation
 - Priority Conservation Area Program
 - Multimodal and transit priority arterials

Estimates include complementary funding sources (in addition to OBAG 3 funds), amounts and programs pending Commission approval

 - Strengthening Mobility and Revolutionizing Transportation (SMART) (NOFO in September)
- ❖ \$17-20B Bridge and Highway
 - Bridge Investment Program
